You should call or stop by the office and request a work order, or get in touch with a BOD member. Please be safe and have an enjoyable 2017 camping season.

FROM ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Hello All Campers. We have been working with Brady Township and there will be a few new changes happening with building permits. As we have been questioning some of these changes, It's going to be a while before we have all the understandable answers. Here are some of the new changes.

1. If building or buying a shed you must get a Campground Permit and a Brady Township Zoning Permit.
2. If building a deck without a roof and it is under 30 inches from the ground you will need a Campground Permit and a Brady Township Zoning Permit.
3. If you are building a deck over 30 inches off the ground you will need a Campground Permit - Brady Township Zoning Permit and a Building Permit from Richardson Inspection Services.
4. If you are putting a roof over your Deck/Patio You will need a Campground Permit, a Brady Township Zoning Permit and a Building Permit from Richardson Inspection Services.
5. Any type of Electric Work you need a Brady Township Zoning Permit and a Richardson Inspection Services Permit.
6. If you are replacing your roof material and are not replacing more than 10% of the wood then you only need a Campground Permit.
7. If you are replacing your roof material and are replacing more than 10% of the wood then you need a Campground Permit, a Brady Township Zoning Permit and a Richardson Inspection permit.

There is still a lot that is undecided on permits with Brady Township. If you have any questions please feel free to ask them.
