Welcome Back Campers and a Special Welcome to all of our new campers joining us this season.

Can you believe its Memorial Day already? Finally, the snowy, freezing weather has broken and we are able to kick off the camping season. Memorial Day is our first busy holiday of the season. Please remember that you, as a member, are required to fill out a guest pass and pay \$10 for each pass filled out. Passes can be filled out at the Main Office during normal business hours and at the Guard Shack. Also, as a member, you are responsible for your guests. Please remind them that here at Moraine Camplands, there are rules that have to be followed. The speed limit is 10mph within the campground and applies to all vehicles and golf carts. Please obey the speed limit as well as all stop signs. Safety is our #1 priority. Since it is a holiday weekend, extra water usage and architectural work must be placed on hold until after the holiday weekend. The Laundry Room will also be closed starting at 11am Friday and will reopen Monday afternoon.

You may have noticed the small upgrades made during the off season. We as a board have been working very hard to get things ready and updating as much as we can. Maintenance has been working on many projects during the winter months. Both the Women's and Men's room in the Dining Hall have been completely upgraded with new walls, ceilings, molding and fixtures and brought up to ADA Compliance. The laundry room has received new digital washers and dryers and the price has remained the same. Please ensure that you get a receipt for all money transactions that you make in the office.

New Trailers: If you have purchased and are bringing a new/used trailer to your lot, please give the office a notice at least 7 days in advance. The delivery date along with a time (2 hour window) will help with our maintenance crew to schedule their days work so they can add in the time needed to be available to meet you at the gate for inspection. This will also help you and your delivery people with not having you delayed in waiting for your inspection.

Disposing of leaves: Only leaves and branches can be disposed in the area behind the Maintenance Garage. This spring we have noticed that people are dumping their garbage there as well. If this continues, more camera's will be installed in the back area and new fines will be imposed.

Household Garbage: Only household garbage may be thrown into our dumpsters. No inside or outdoor furniture, No Scrap metal/wood,

Dog Leashes: Your dog must be on a 6 foot leash at all times when they are not on your lot. Please refer to rule 206 in our Rules and Regulations.

Quiet Hours: Please ensure that you and your guests follow the rules of the quiet hours which are from 12:01am to 8am.

WiFi: If you are not paid for on our Wifi system, please turn off Wifi on your devices and also request your family/guests to do so as well. Having these turned on still ping our repeaters which causes a slow down of our system.

Lot and Golf Cart Numbers: Please make sure your lot number is placed on your lot/trailer where it can be visible from the road. This is mandated but is also a great way to find your lot if an emergency is needed. Golf Cart lot numbers must be 3 inches high and visible on the front and back of your golf cart.

Speed Limit: No matter what you are driving, the Speed Limit in our Campground is **10mph**. This is to ensure safety for all of our families.

Boats and Coastguard Approved Oversized Rafts: There must be a coastguard approved flotation device for each occupant. Children age 12 and under must wear life jacket.
